English

This week's learning tasks are based on Information Texts. What information texts do you have in your home? What do you know about information texts?

1. 'To understand what a noun is.' Use the PowerPoint resource to explore the meaning of a 'noun'.
2. 'To understand that a non-fiction book tells us facts.' Explore a range of non-fiction texts to identify the features of this text type.
3. 'To write full sentences to describe.' Write sentences to describe Lego.
4. 'To read and understand simple words and sentences.' Complete *Lesson 1 English Resource*. Match pictures to CVC words and simple sentences.
5. 'To write full sentences to explain.' Write sentences to describe how we play with Lego.

3. 'To compare numbers using the terms 1 more than and 1 less than.' Practise the skills by completing 'One More, One Less' Worksheets in the Lesson Resources.
4. 'To be able to apply knowledge of numbers to solve problems.' Refer to *English Guidance* to practise these skills.
