Weekly Learning Tasks for week beginning 19.10.20



These tasks cover various skills in **English** & **Maths** linked to work being covered in the classroom this week. Please read through the guidance and watch the video tutorial that introduces and explains the learning. There may also be accompanying resources that you can use to practise skills covered. English

This week's learning tasks are based on Information Texts. What information texts do you have in your home? What do you know about information texts?

Refer to the *English Guidance* and *Video Tutorial* to support you with this week's learning objectives.

1. **'To sort fiction and non-fiction books.'** Look at the example texts in the *English Guidance* and sort them into groups- fiction and non-fiction.
2. **'To retrieve information.'** Look at the example texts in the *English Guidance* and identify what clues the pictures give you about the text-type.
3. **'To write a factual sentence.'** Write a sentence about a toy of your choice?
4. **'To form letters correctly.'** Check your work to make sure that your letter formation is correct. Re-write your sentence in your best handwriting, taking care to include capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

The lesson resources include independent tasks that practise a range of skills to support learning in Year 1.

Maths

The lesson objectives for this week are:

- 'To understand that a number is made up of other numbers' and
- 'To find as many ways as possible to make a number bond'

1. Sort the cupcakes into piles two show two numbers that make '5'.
2. Use a number line to find one more and one less than a one or two digit number.
3. Look at the images and count to identify which has 'more' and which has 'fewer'/'less'.
