Weekly Learning Tasks for week beginning 04.01.21

These tasks cover various skills **English, Maths, Creative** and **Investigative**.

We recommend completing the 4 purple tasks plus 4 or more of the tasks for this week. The activities that are **bold and underlined** may require more adult support. Enjoy! 😊

Maths

- ❖ Research the 5 most endangered 'Deadly 60' animals. Compare how their numbers have fallen over a period of time and create a graph of your choice which best represents this.
- ❖ Measure/make a salt dough 'Deadly 60' animal to accompany your fact file.
- ❖ Play the 'Deadly 60 Top Trumps' game provided in the resources for this week. Which animal has the highest Killer Rating? Which has the most speed? And stealth?
- ❖ Identify 5 'Deadly 60' animals you would like to see for real. Plot where they live on a world map. Plan a trip, including costings of flights/accommodation; record miles travelled and the countries/continents you would visit to see all 5!

Creative

- ❖ Debate topic - should humans be included in the 'Deadly 60' list? Why should/shouldn't we be included?
- ❖ Draw your favourite animal from the 'Deadly 60' in its natural habitat or create a model of it! You could use things from your recycling box, Lego, papier mache - anything you like!
- ❖ Create your own 'Beetle' style game to play with your family based on one of the 'Deadly 60'. Things to consider/include: create a box using a net, branding/advertisement, instructions of how to play.
- ❖ Explore the artwork of Oenone Hammersley. Which is your favourite animal painting? Why? Let your teacher know!



Investigative

- ❖ Use Google's new AR feature to research an animal from the 'Deadly 60' and screenshot it somewhere in your home/garden.
- ❖ Create the British 'Deadly 20'. Research and list the 20 most dangerous creatures found in and around the British Isles and rank them in order (number 1 being the most dangerous native animal) - Be prepared to justify your choices!
- ❖ Create a historical 'Deadly 5' of creatures who have lived in the British Isles but are now extinct/not found in the wild any longer.
